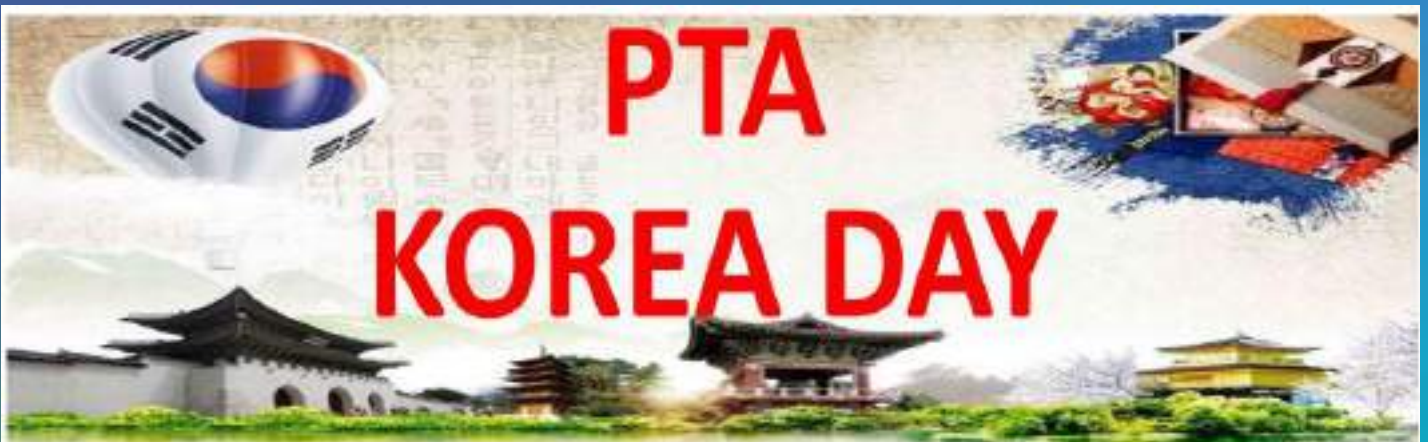

ISE UNICEF Blue Day

UNICEF, or the United Nations Children's Fund, was created by the United Nations in the aftermath of WW2 and is responsible for providing humanitarian and developmental aid to children worldwide. The key document underlying UNICEF's work is the UN Convention on the Rights of Child (UNCRC), the most complete statement of children's rights ever produced. The UNCRC is the most widely ratified international human rights treaty in history and lays out a child's rights in political, economic, social, and cultural criteria, which all children are entitled to. It also demonstrates adults' and governments' responsibilities in ensuring all children are allowed these rights.

The convention's implementation has vastly changed the perception of children throughout the world, clearly defining children as a distinct social group with specific needs, interests, and perspectives. In nations surrounding our home, such as the Philippines, there has been a flourishing rise in children's clubs, youth groups, and sports development initiatives. Children in Laos monitor water and sanitation projects, and projects in Cambodia see children as stakeholders in local government planning processes and so much more.

On November 20th, UNICEF celebrated the anniversary of the adoption of the UNCRC. Here at ISE, we stand by the UNCRC. To raise awareness of the issue of children's rights and to promote the excellent work that UNICEF is doing, we all dressed in UNICEF's blue color on November 21st.

Secondary School IB Biology G11



Grade 11 Biology students completed an experiment this week where they extended their knowledge of osmosis. They used dialysis tubing to simulate cell membranes. And used Benedict's solution and Iodine to determine if starch and/or glucose diffused out of the dialysis tubing.
