This week we studied poetry and connected to Global issues

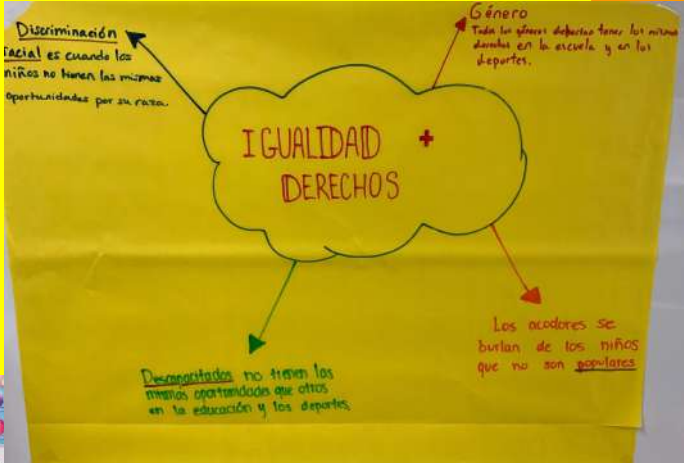
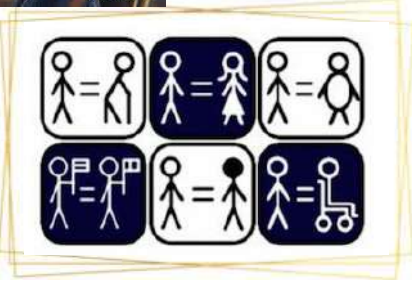
Science, technology, the environment
